TATIANA, LINCOLN CENTER

OSTERIA NONNINO, WEST VILLAGE

A hidden gem in the West Village, this familyowned Italian spot offers warmth, charm, and some of the most satisfying pasta in the city. It's beloved for its intimate vibe, neighborhood consistently delicious dishes.



HANGAWI, KOREATOWN

MACE, GREENWICH VILLAGE

EXPERIMENTAL COCKTAIL CLUB, FLATIRON






SOUTH STREET, SEAPORT

PLACES TO VISIT



TENEMENT MUSEUM, LOWER EAST SIDE

This fascinating museum brings immigrant stories to life through restored apartments and guided tours that showcase how families lived in New York from the 19th to 20th centuries. It's an immersive, moving experience that connects history to the present day.



BUTTERFIELD MARKET, UPPER EAST SIDE

More than just a market, Butterfield is an Upper East Side institution known for gourmet food, prepared meals, and local charm. It's a great stop to grab provisions, discover specialty items, or simply soak in a slice of neighborhood life.

CHELSEA HOTEL, CHELSEA

An icon of art and counterculture, the Chelsea Hotel has been home writers, musicians, and artists for over а century. beautifully restored, it's worth visiting for its historic aura, eclectic past, and the chance to enjoy its restaurant or bar in an atmosphere thick with creative legend.



THE ELEVATED ACRE, FINANCIAL DISTRICT

A tucked-away rooftop park hidden between skyscrapers, offering rare peace, greenery, and great views of the East River. Perfect for a quiet moment above the city bustle.



MMUSEUMM, CHINATOWN

This tiny museum housed in a former freight elevator features rotating exhibits of curious everyday objects. It's quirky, unexpected, and a true slice of New York creativity.

JEFFERSON LIBRARY, WEST VILLAGE

Once a courthouse in the 19th century, this Gothic Revival building now serves as a public library. Its architecture is striking, and the tower feels like stepping into another era.



THE CLOISTERS, FORT TRYON PARK

Part of the Met, this medieval-style museum overlooks the Hudson River and feels worlds away from Midtown. The gardens, tapestries, and architecture are both serene and stunning.



GREEN-WOOD CEMETERY, PROSPECT PARK

Not just a resting place, Green-Wood is a National Historic Landmark filled with rolling hills, elaborate mausoleums, and incredible views of the Manhattan skyline. A peaceful and contemplative place to wander.

BUSHWICK COLLECTIVE STREET ART, BUSHWICK

An outdoor gallery of murals and graffiti by artists from around the world, the Bushwick Collective turns blocks of industrial Brooklyn into a vibrant open-air museum.
